

## Erik Brouwer The Real Pink Panthers True Crime

In this new true crime book Erik Brouwer dives into the world of the most famous jewel thieving gang in the world: The Pink Panthers. Of course lending their name from the crime comedy by Blake Edwards. The gang consists of about 200 rotating members from the former Yugoslavia. Since 1999, they have been traveling through Europe with the passports of deceased Balkan soldiers to rob jewellers. Back in Serbia, Montenegro or other Balkan states, they were protected by their governments until recently.

The book starts and ends in Maastricht, because this is where the most recent robbery took place: in 2022. Dressed up as Peaky Blinders the looters, armed with hammers and toy guns, rushed into the MECC during TEFAF Fine Art Fair plundering Countess Zoubova's yellow diamond and multiple valuable other jewels and jewellery. Totally in style, taking off on electric scooters. It was the most recent of at least 150 robberies attributed to The Pink Panthers, with a total loot of approximately half a billion euro's.

The way The Pink Panthers operate is very appealing, dressing up - imitating pop culture and cinema - as modern Robin Hood, stealing from the rich, bringing back to the poor in the Balkan. But not only does Brouwer let the reader in on the way they operate. His book also show how they exploit their background and reveal The Netherlands as an ideal base for international and organized crime.


# Nando Boers Tom Dumoulin My life on the road

Tom Dumoulin (1990) is considered one of the best road cyclist of his generation. He had an interest in playing football at first, he only got in touch with cycling on a rather late age. He had something to proof. He wanted to show he was worth something, to show he was capable of something exceptional.

And indeed he was. He climbed the ranks of junior competitions and leagues and was ready to sign his first pro contract with Rabobank Continental at the age of 18, soon to be followed by a contract at Argos Shimano. They saw his talent and made him into the time trial specialist. His career lasted until 2022, winning two Olympic Medals, two World titles, multiple stages in all three Grand Tours and of course his biggest achievement winning Giro d'Italia in 2017.

In this book Dumoulin travels back to the places crucial in his career (Bergen Norway, Monza, Oropa, Bormio, Stelvio in Italy and Arcalis, Andorra) where he reflects on the specific days where he excelled and let's author Nando Boers in on the top level of pro cycling his thoughts and doubts, his achievements and frustrations, his rivals, victories, defeats, crashes and ambitions.

He shows us his personal route from an rotten era when cycling was a sport clouded with doping, evolving into a digital and data obsessed time where riders are considered manufacturable and exchangeable. Nevertheless, this biography is his love letter to cycling.

### The Bicycle of Henri de Toulouse Lautrec Arts, drugs and racing in Paris during Belle Épogue

The international capital of sport this summer will be Paris, France, hosting the 2024 Olympic Games. In the procycling calender there is no name more dominant than Paris. And that has always been the case. Paris is hometown of Tour de France and host of numerous other races.

In the last decades of the 19<sup>th</sup> century Paris was famous for it track cycling culture. Paris was home of a variety of tracks, the most popular discipline at the time. French artist and painter Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec was a huge fan of the sport and could be found in the stands amongst the spectators.

His oeuvre contains multiple commercial poster for bike manufacturers and other cycling components as chains and tubes. With one of his poster – for a new chain, La Chaîne Simpson– something noticeable is the matter. An early version was rejected because of the recognizable image of Welsh rider Jimmi Michael and his questionable coach Choppy Warburton. Is it a coincidence that the early death of two of his other riders lead to the removal of Warburton from the poster?

Flammish author Jan Boesman (Gent, 1981) stumbles upon this intriguing matter and wrote a book on the connection between art, cycling, doping and capital of track cycling in the belle epoque. His debut book *The Flying Negro and the Little Queen* was a portrait of the cyclist Major Tayler. ### Cathelijne Verboeket Krul Letting Life go

### A nurse, het patients and the process of dying, at home and in the hospice

Nursing specialist Cathelijne Verboeket-Crul has attended hundreds of deathbeds and supervises the care of patients day and night. In *Letting Life Go* she gives a unique insight into what the run-up to death can look like, with the choices and dilemmas that come with it. She writes about palliative care and euthanasia, deathbed visions and sexuality, and people who consciously stop eating and drinking to hasten death.

The book offers insight and comfort to anyone dealing with one of the most vulnerable moments in a human life: the dying process. Verboeket-Crul writes about subjects as preferred position of death, life questions and the connection with 'the higher', supernatural experiences and the thin line between life and death, active termination of life, desires and connections, acceleration to death, brain deficits, the corona pandemic, dying the way you lived, and the chosen farewell at home. It especially zooms in on The Netherlands and the way it deals with the self-chosen end of life such as euthanasia and consciously stopping eating and drinking or palliative sedation.





### Rosanne Kropman The Darkest Dark A history of Sobibor

After Auschwitz, Sobibor is one of Europe's biggest mass graves. From 1942 onwards, more than 170,000 Jews were gassed here immediately upon arrival in a year and a half. Yet few people know this extermination camp. After a successful prisoner uprising in October 1943, Sobibor was closed by the Nazis and the traces erased as much as possible.

The silence at the site of the camp came to an end in 2014. Investigative journalist Rosanne Kropman is on site when archaeologists excavate the foundations of the eight gas chambers. Shovel by shovel, the contours of the former camp emerge. From that moment on, Kropman starts looking for traces of the camp. She meets the last survivors of the uprising and their families, tells stories of the perpetrators and sees the difficult dealings in Poland with the Holocaust heritage. *The darkest darkness* sheds new light on the mystery that Sobibor remains to this day.



World's toughest ultramarathon

A bizarre running competition takes place every year in Frozen Head State Park, a vast forest in eastern Tennessee. For years it has been considered the most extreme 100 mile running race in the world. There is no website, the registration procedure is secret and only one person, the race director Lazarus Lake (Gary Cantrell), knows exactly when the race will start. In the 35-year history, only 15 runners have managed to reach the finish. The Barkley Marathon is inspired by James Earl Ray's escape attempt from the nearby prison. The murderer of Martin Luther King lasted more than fifty hours in the wilderness of Frozen Head before he was found. Most participants of the Barkley give up on the road after getting lost in the thick fog, or because of exhaustion, hypothermia and heavy hallucinations during the sixty hours they are on the road, or simply because they no longer see fit.

In 2012 Michiel Panhuysen was the first and so far the only Dutchman at the start of the Barkley. And despite being a trained ultra-runner, he has so far only managed to complete two of the five rounds of the Barkley in a total of five attempts. He will return in 2022 to talk to the organizers and participants about the legendary ultra, which is the ultimate challenge for most runners.

**Michiel Panhuysen** is a journalist, writer and ultra-runner. The Barkley will be his first book about ultras. It fits in with an increasingly popular and extreme form of running that is about to take on an increasingly commercial form.


# Erik Brouwer The Fighter of Auschwitz Leen Sanders and survival of the death camps

Leendert 'Leen' Josua Sanders is one of the best Dutch boxers of all time. He grew up in one of the poorest neighborhoods of Rotterdam in an Orthodox Jewish family and struggled out of poverty in the classical way through his sport. He became Dutch champion several times and fought three legendary matches against Olympic Champion (1928) Bep van Klaveren. He won the European title and also made a name for himself as a professional boxer in the United Kingdom and Nazi Germany, where he fought with a Jewish Star of David on his shorts.

But the Nazis deported him to Auschwitz in 1942. His wife and children had to turn left before his eyes, in the direction of the gas chambers. He himself was approached during the selection by an SS officer who looked at his cauliflower ears and asked: 'Boxer?' Leen replied in the affirmative.

During his imprisonment he fought box matches in order to survive and stay out of trouble. These matches were common entertainment for SS officers in the camps. He got a relatively good job and saved many lives by stealing the food and secretly sharing it. After the liberation, ex-campmates from home and abroad called him 'The Angel of Auschwitz' and 'The God of Auschwitz'.

Most matches took place on Sundays. Then a ring was placed on the roll call area. When it rained or froze, the Nazis moved the ring to a warehouse or canteen. The main prize was good food. Fighting was done with bare hands or with the gloves of SS men. Weight classes did not exist, a lightweight regularly had to compete against a middle or heavyweight. Kapos fought against prisoners, SS men against prisoners. The Nazis most enjoyed matches between two Jews. The more blood that flowed, the better it was. Sanders and the other boxers knew that losing could kill.

#### Why Swedish women won't work for free

The Dutch likes to see themselves as modern and progressive. But the ratio between women and men is significantly different here than in other Western countries. For example, Dutch women are often more highly educated than men, but they work part-time a lot. This makes them more financially dependent on their partners than women in the rest of Europe.

On that basis, they are often dismissed as spoiled part-time princesses, but the system certainly does not cooperate, as Swedish journalist Charlotte Boström noticed when she came to live in the Netherlands for love. Why do you file tax returns with your partner family and not as an individual? Why is parental leave for men so terribly minimal? Why do you only receive part of your salary during care leave?

In Sweden, women like to work full time and are financially independent. With the gaze of a curious and astonished outsider, Boström often humorously shows that the whole of the Netherlands, despite reforms such as free childcare, seems set up to maintain unequal relationships. How hard would it be to change that? And do the Dutch actually want that?


### Raounak Khaddari No Hard Feelings On how friendship works. Or doesn't.

# Leen Schaap Burning down the House How a degenerate culture at government institutions can continue to exist

In 2016, Leen Schaap was appointed commander of Amsterdam's fire department. Hoping to tackle the racism, discrimination and bullying taking place within the department, Schaap faced heavy resistance from some of his colleagues, who form a tight-knit brotherhood with a culture of silence. Nasty political games, harassment, and threats ensued. In Burn Down the House, he reveals his struggles, contemplations and findings during this time, showing the reader that these are not one-off incidents, but instead the logical outcome of years of neglect. In a time when movements like Black Lives Matter have been demanding structural change to public institutions that are supposed to protect people, Schaap proves the advantages of great leadership in this brave attempt to revolutionize the very core of a rotten institution.

**Leen Schaap** (1961) is currently a police commissioner. From 2016 to 2019 he led the Amsterdam fire brigade as commander.


